The Philippine Embassy in Madrid wishes to provide the following update on the conditions in

Spain with regard to the coronavirus (COVID-19):

The active confirmed cases in Spain as of March 10, 2020 is 1,245, with thirty-one (31) confirmed

deaths, and thirty-two (32) confirmed recoveries.

Most of those with COVID-19 were reportedly in good or stable condition, and in certain cases

are being provided treatment in their homes.

No Filipino has been reported as being under observation. The Embassy will be notified by the

Spanish authorities if there are Filipinos among the confirmed cases.

The Philippine Embassy wishes to announce that starting Wednesday, March 11, the Consular

Section and POLO Madrid will be operating from 10 AM to 3 PM, to reduce congestion within the

Embassy premises and encourage consular applicants to avoid rush hour traffic and crowds.

The Philippine Embassy will consult with concerned Filipino organizations on whether it will still

continue or suspend consular outreach missions to various cities in Spain as indicated for the

calendar year 2020. The primary aim of this review is to ensure the health and well-being of the

organizers, Embassy personnel, and the applicants.

Countries all over the world are issuing new travel restrictions and advisories. In this regard, the

Filipino community is advised to set aside travel plans if they feel unwell or have developed

respiratory symptoms. If you develop symptoms of acute respiratory infection, it is advised to stay

at home, do not go to the hospital, and call 112 for medical service.

Filipinos are advised to be mindful of their health and strengthen their immune system, while

taking practical hygiene measures and avoid contact with people with flu-like illnesses. Observe

basic hygiene, such as washing hands with soap and water frequently, and covering your mouth

and nose when coughing or sneezing, preferably using disposable tissues.
